In December 2021, I literally read and graded the wonderful papers that gave life to this anthology with a heavy but totally open heart while grieving our beloved feminist ancestor and teacher bell hooks. I felt the same way when Gloria Anzaldúa died in 2004.

I wrote: But what a blessing is to have her words now caressing my soul as I cry. Now that she transcended, now that she is no longer in this material world,

her wisdom continues to take care of me:

Love invites us to grieve for the dead as ritual of mourning and as celebration.

As we speak our hearts in mourning we share our intimate knowledge of the dead, of who they were and how they lived.

We honor their presence by naming the legacies they leave us.

We need not contain grief when we use it as a means to intensify our love for the dead and dying, for those who remain alive.

—bell hooks, *All about love* (2000)
